POSITION OVERVIEW

Emily Johnson / Catalyst seeks a New York City-based production manager in support of the development process and premiere for her latest work, *BEING FUTURE BEING*, currently scheduled to premiere at The Broad Stage in Los Angeles in September 2022. Candidates should be experienced production managers with a strong understanding of contemporary dance and performance, and be excited to participate in a project that centers Indigenous artists and knowledges, and is rooted in processes of decolonization. The production manager reports to the Artistic Director and project producer, and is responsible for scheduling, project managing fabrication, load-ins, and load-outs, liaising between artists, project producer, stage management, and venues to keep production crews on track and within budgetary constraints, and successfully managing in-progress presentations at UMass Amherst in February 2021 and UCLA in April/May 2022, the premiere at The Broad Stage in September 2022, and for the touring life of the project.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

Being Future Being is a multi-scalar work, created by Emily Johnson for the stage and beyond. Featuring a newly commissioned score by Raven Chacon, Being Future Being conjures present joy, and seeks to usher in new futures with the potential to reshape the way we relate to ourselves, and to the human and more-than-human cohabitants of our worlds. With Being Future Being, the performance is a starting point for relationship, one that asks audiences to join in a community process that flows from each presentation, out and into the world—actions brought to fruition with community stewardship. Being Future Being's creative process is Indigenous-led, and developed in collaboration with organizations and organizers in ways that foster Indigenous kin, accomplices, and audience relationships.

ABOUT EMILY JOHNSON / CATALYST

Emily Johnson is an artist who makes body-based work. She is a land and water protector and an activist for justice, sovereignty and well-being. A Bessie Award-winning choreographer, Guggenheim Fellow and recipient of the Doris Duke Artist Award, she is based in Lenapehoking / New York City. Emily is of the Yup'ik Nation, and since 1998 has created work that considers the experience of sensing and seeing performance. Her dances function as portals and care processions, they engage audienceship within and through space, time, and environment- interacting with a place's architecture, peoples, history and role in building futures. Emily hosts monthly ceremonial fires on Mannahatta in partnership with Abrons Arts Center and Karyn Recollet. She was a co-compiler of the document, *Creating New Futures: Guidelines for Ethics and Equity in the Performing Arts* and is part of an advisory group—with Reuben Roqueni, Ed Bourgeois, Lori Pourier, Ronee Penoi, and Vallejo Gantner—developing a First Nations Performing Arts Network.

Catalyst works from within the performing arts field to increase recognition, support and equity for Indigenous performance art practice, presenting and research. We understand and honor the need to recognize self-determined artistic and community practices, to uphold healing, relationality, and to center Indigenous individuals and communities during the process of dismantling colonial systems, asserting

sovereignty, and aligning with generations-long efforts. We understand the performing arts system globally as one that continues to marginalize and harm Indigenous people and land; we understand the power that performance and story wields in this moment and envision its potential to foster positive social change.

Developmental Residency at UMass-Amherst: February 22-March 1

Premiere Rehearsal and Performances at The Broad Stage: August-September 2022

In addition to being available for all key dates for rehearsal and premiere, the project touring window will continue following premiere through 2023, and added dates will be determined in collaboration with presenters and company.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Manage all advance communications regarding technical needs between artistic director, producer, designers, and presenting venues;
- Lead complex scheduling of load-in, technical rehearsals, and load-out;
- Manage load-in and load-out in multiple venues, including union and non-union crews;
- Collaborate with designers and engineers to ensure the safe and successful execution of all technical aspects of the production;
- Coordinate on-time travel/shipping of all production materials and equipment;
- Evaluate potential presenting venues for feasibility given the specific needs of the production;
- All other tasks necessary to ensure successful and timely load-in and load-out processes;
- Create and oversee the production budget, ensuring all activities stay within the budget.

SKILLS AND QUALIFICATIONS

- Able to support Indigenous processes of respect, care and reciprocity and ensure that those values are followed at all levels of communications, planning and work;
- Demonstrated passion for, and knowledge of, the field of contemporary dance and performance;
- Strong understanding of the production needs and budgetary concerns of a creative process from development to live premiere performance;
- Strong knowledge of Vectorworks and/or CAD software;
- Highly motivated, with the ability to work independently to manage and meet deadlines;
- Flexible and responsive to shifting priorities, with an eagerness to tackle new challenges;
- Strong organizational skills, paired with clear communication skills;
- Strong understanding, or quick-study, of multiple online tools and other software, including Google and Microsoft Apps;
- Lighting design skills a plus, and additional compensation is available for design fees.

COMPENSATION

Flat rate \$5000-\$6000 depending on experience, plus housing, travel, and per diem for out-of-town residencies and presentations.
